

2011 ONTARIO FISHING LICENCE OPTIONS FOR NON-CANADIAN RESIDENTS

The non-Canadian resident licence fees stated below are in effect from January 1, 2011, until December 31, 2011. Unless otherwise noted, Ontario Fishing Licences can be purchased at a number of licence issuers throughout the province (*service stations, sporting goods stores, marinas, etc...*). Fees below are in Canadian Funds. **Note:** For those who plan on entering remote regions of Ontario from Manitoba, the only Ontario Fishing Licence issuer in Manitoba is Blue Water Air Services located in Silver Falls.

■ Non-Canadian Resident Fishing Outdoors Card. Valid for 3 years.	\$ 9.68
■ Sport Fishing Licence Tag – valid for the calendar year	\$ 76.49
■ Conservation Fishing Licence Tag – valid for the calendar year	\$ 47.13
■ 8-day Sport Fishing Licence Tag (8 consecutive days)	\$ 49.02
■ 8-day Conservation Fishing Licence Tag (8 consecutive days)	\$ 28.27
■ 1-day Sport Fishing Licence (available from many licence issuers and Service Ontario offices)	\$ 20.75
■ Angling Licence for a Member of an Organized Camp (available at Service Ontario offices only)	\$ 5.13 per child

Good to Know

Your Outdoors Card provides privileges to you alone; is not transferable.
 An Outdoors Card alone is NOT a fishing licence – must be accompanied with a fishing licence tag.
 Remember to carry your Outdoors Card with you at all times when fishing.
 If a Conservation Officer asks to see your licence, the law states that you must show it.
 It is illegal to bring any live fish, crayfish, live leeches or salamanders into Ontario for use as bait
 Do not release live bait nor dump the contents of a bait bucket including the water into any waters.
 Sydney and Rowdy Lakes are within the “North Kenora Pilot Project” and as such, conservation limits apply when fishing these waters.

Woodland Caribou Provincial Park is within Zone 2
